HUDSON REC SURVEY SUMMARY

An on-line survey was widely disseminated to Hudson residents. The survey was open from April 2, 2018 to May 18, 2018. Hard copies were also available in English, Spanish and Portuguese. There were 407 respondents.

WHO TOOK THE SURVEY

The majority of respondents were:

- female (75%)
- Hudson residents (95%)
- Between the ages of 35 and 49 (68%)
- With children under 10 years old (55%) and with children between 10 and 18 (51%)
- Married (83%)
- Live near Forest Ave. (29%) and Farley Elementary School (26%)

PERCEPTIONS AND COMMUNICATION

- A large majority (58%) of respondents reported an overall positive perception of Hudson Recreation when asked this question directly. Additionally a large number of respondents when asked for additional comments expressed positive feelings towards Hudson Recreation by their comment "Great Job. Thank you." A number also expressed their appreciation for the survey.
- A very large majority (80%) said they find Hudson Recreation programs and events to be affordable.
- Many survey respondents use social media. Most (88%) use Facebook regularly
 and a majority (56%) report that they follow Hudson Recreation on Facebook,
 however, a significant number (44%) say they do not.
- The majority of respondents (41%) stated that the most pressing issue facing
 Hudson Recreation is Funding. This was followed by Maintenance (27%) and Lack
 of Programs (25%).

KEY SURVEY HIGHLIGHTS

The following are ideas compiled from responses from all the survey questions. For the most part they represent majority opinions, although some are ideas suggested by only a few but seemed to be in the same spirit as the opinions of others.

programming as well as suggestions for additional new ones.

NEW FACILITIES

Most popular suggestions regarding new facilities and programs included:

- Dog Park
- Community/Recreation Center
- "Central Playground" (like that in Littleton, Sudbury, Northborough)
- Expand **non-athletic programming** (to include art, STEM, cooking, etc.)
- Turf field (especially at Morgan Bowl)

The **number one** new facility respondents said they would like to see by far was a **DOG PARK**

Also:

- Pool (indoor/outdoor)
- Outdoor basketball
- More walking/hiking trails

Some respondents stated that they preferred taking better care of the existing facilities and improving these to extending to new ones.

IMPROVEMENTS TO EXISTING FACILITIES

Facilities most cited as needing improvement (this may to some extent be influence by the age(s) of the respondents' children and/or where they live in relation to the various parks and playgrounds and therefore, which ones they visit/use):

- Wood Park
- Moulton's Field
- Cherry St.
- Forest Ave.
- Centennial Beach

The three park/playgrounds/fields respondents felt were **most neglected** and in the greatest need for maintenance and upgrading are

WOOD PARK, MOULTON'S and CHERRY STREET.

Improvements called for include:

- Addition of Amenities
 - Bathrooms
 - Shaded seating areas, tables, picnic areas, bleachers
 - Trash/recycling bins
 - o Fencing around play areas, especially the Splash Pad
 - More parking
- ADA Accessibility
- Upgraded equipment, regular monitoring for safety
- Opportunities for wide range of ages to enjoy
- Attention to cleanliness and safety
- Improve Access
 - o Review rules regarding use (including for non-residents)
 - o ADA accessibility

SUGGESTIONS FOR OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS

Respondents had a number of suggestions regarding ways to improve the management and operation of the Hudson Recreation Division. These included:

Better more accessible information

- More timely dissemination of information regarding programs (esp. with regard to summer programming)
- Update website
- Create on-line calendar
- Informational signage at facility locations

Some respondents reported being unaware of some of the Town's existing resources and offerings.

Expand seasons/times

• Working parents expressed a desire for programs to be more aligned with their needs, e.g. during half school days, afterschool, summer, etc. (some said they end up going to other Towns for additional programming, better hours)

Improve Maintenance

- Cleanliness, trash pick up
- Trimming grass, picking up brush and branches

Increase capacity

- · Hire more staff
- Recruit more volunteers
- Create more opportunities for teens to volunteer
- Partner with relevant others (including schools, non-profit, private organizations)



The majority of respondents reported preferring additional events be developed for **Middle and High School students** (62%), with half (50%) preferring events for **Grade School children**. Almost a third (28%) said they would like more events for 31-45 year olds.



8. WHAT IS YOUR OVERALL PERCEPTION OF THE TOWN OF HUDSON'S DIVISION OF RECREATION?


A majority (58%) of respondents reported having an overall **positive** perception regarding Hudson's Division of Recreation, followed by 35% with neutral attitudes and less than 7% with negative perceptions of the Division.

9. WHAT DO YOU FEEL IS THE MOST PRESSING ISSUE FACING HUDSON RECREATION?

A majority of respondents (41%) reported that they felt that the most pressing issue facing Hudson Recreation is **Funding**. This was followed by **Maintenance** (27%) and **Lack of Programs** (25%).

Additional issues offered by respondents included:

- Lack of awareness/ Lack of information regarding existing resources
 - Many felt that the information especially regarding summer programs



was not provided in time for them to make their family's plans

 Suggestions included an e-newsletter, better use of town website, calendar of events

Need for more staff (related to funding)



A large majority (80%) of the survey respondents reported feeling that Hudson Recreation programs and events **are affordable**. Only 2% felt they are not affordable and 18% are unsure.

DEMOGRAPHICS

15. ARE YOU A HUDSON RESIDENT?

A significant majority of survey respondents are **Hudson residents** (95%).

16. PLEASE SELECT YOUR GENDER.

Three-quarters of the survey respondents are **female** (75%).

17. PLEASE SELECT YOUR AGE GROUP.

The large majority (68%) of those responding to the survey are between 35 and 49 years old. The majority (27%) are 35-39 years old, followed by 23% who are 40-44 and 19% who are 45-49.

18. DO YOU HAVE CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF 10?

Over half (55%) of the survey respondents have children under 10 years old.

19. DO YOU HAVE CHILDREN BETWEEN THE AGES OF 10-18?

Over half (51%) of the survey respondents have children between the ages of 10 and 18.

20. WHAT IS YOUR EMPLOYMENT STATUS?


The majority (77%) of those who responded to the survey are employed.

21. WHAT IS YOUR MARITAL STATUS?

A large majority (83%) of those who responded to the survey are married.

22. WHICH HUDSON SCHOOL DO YOU LIVE CLOSEST TO?

The majority and almost one-third (29%)of those who responded to the survey live near Forest Ave. Elementary School, followed by those who live near Farley Elementary School (26%). There was little participation in the survey by those individuals who live near Hubert School (less than 4%).
